PREPARATION FOR THE MEETING

Water and care for the environment: an educational question

- Water is a precious resource essential for life, and yet we risk a great scarcity of water within a few decades if urgent action is not taken. We must be aware of the value of this resource. God has entrusted to us as believers the task of caring for and protecting "our common home" for future generations.
- Pope Francis invites us through the encyclical Laudato si: "The water problem is partly a question of education and culture, due to lack of awareness of the seriousness of certain everyday behaviors."
- **Reflecting on the effects and problems related to lack of water** can help us understand the great challenge faced daily by large sections of the population in some African countries.

What can teenagers do:

- They cannot yet influence world politics, but they can grow in responsibility and awareness of the impact of their lifestyle on water resources. They can shape their attitudes and spread them among friends and throughout their cities. They can also participate in initiatives already going on, like World Water Day.
- A water well. Perhaps one person alone cannot provide it, but a family or a group of families, or a parish all together, can. Some of the projects of AMU are directed toward access to drinking water. One can also contribute with small donations.
