"Blessed are the pure in heart, for they will see God" (Mt 5:8)

Meaning of the words

heart for the Jews, the heart indicates the center of feelings,

thoughts and intentions of the human person. We can see God through our heart because it summarizes the human being in his or her capacity to love and to be loved.

purs in heart whoever has, in his/her heart and conscience, the intention to look at God openly and at their brothers and sisters with honesty.



Goal

- To become aware that our relationship with God is a precious good to protect.
- To deepen the concept of purity in human relations and to conduct a lifestyle that respects the dignity and the freedom of the person.



How did it go?

At the start, there is a moment of welcome, wherein it is important to allow space for dialogue and the sharing of what each one has lived, the experiences made, and the difficulties encountered. To welcome means to make each one feel accepted and be at ease: creativity will help us find the best ways. We may recall the aims set at the last meeting: "How did it go?"

GROUP LEADER GUIDE



Introductory activity

TYPE: Digital photography

TIME: Estimate at least 1 hour; eventually, allow the group enough time to finish the work

MATERIALS: Digital camera or cell phones; posters; colored pens; scissors, printer

PROCEDURE: If needed, divide the group into sub-groups. The ideal number is 5-6 members. Ask the youth to think and take some pictures representing those who are pure in heart and the relationship among them. Print out the pictures, cut them out, and paste on a poster. Ask the youth to find a title to summarize the meaning given to this beatitude. The youth may sign their names on the poster, to indicate their acceptance of the proposed model of purity. An alternative to the print out version can be a PowerPoint presentation. Besides taking the pictures themselves, they can search the Internet for suitable images, phrases or citations.

It's important to emphasize that to be pure and to live purely is not only about our sexuality, but our entire life. It's a way of thinking and living the relationships (with others and with God). It makes us persons who are attentive to our own freedom and dignity as well as that of others.

Once the artwork is done, each group may show the result to the others, giving the reason for the choice of the pictures, the title or eventual sentences/words inserted in the poster/ PowerPoint presentation.

CONCLUSION: Allow space for dialogue. Some sample questions: Is there something we have understood through the activity that we want to share to others? What seemed difficult or what gave us joy? What challenges do we face each day to put this beatitude into practice?



eledependence was creeping into my family. Among us siblings, we began to lose interest in others, we quarreled often, had low grades in school, and imitated TV models. Talking it over with our parents, we noticed that the TV had enslaved us and, above all, made us unhappy. Its false messages conditioned us, stifling the love within us. Our parents proposed that we stop watching TV for a month; it seemed the only way to get back a pure heart. We all agreed to put the TV inside a cabinet. At the start, it was not easy because it had become a vice to look at it each

time we were free. But the relationship in our family became more beautiful. We talked often, walked more improvised together, acting, visited friends, invented games, and someone learned how to cook by helping our mother. To be updated, we read newspapers or listened to the radio. Everyone's grades in school improved. When we calculated how long we did not watch TV, we realized that 2 years had passed: we got cured! Now the TV has returned to it's former place. Once in a while we turn it on and watch together, but only when there are good shows.

ENJOYING GOD'S PRESENCE

Chiara Lubich, Gen 3 Congress, The Beatitudes, June 20, 1975

If a boy or girl is not sincere in heart, if he or she doesn't place God's interests before their own, if a thousand evil desires fill their hearts, it's evident that they cannot see God. Jesus calls "happy" those who have a heart that is pure, that is, those who maintain their heart full of thoughts of love, mercy, purity, and sincerity, and are detached from things which impede us from following Jesus and the laws of God. Let's look at Mary. She is the creature who was most truly pure of heart; she didn't have any personal interests, she wasn't attached to material things or even to her plans, but only to the will of God.

And now that she is in heaven, not only does she have the highest vision of God, but even during her earthly life God took on human flesh from her, and they lived together in the same house.

In the same way, many saints, many boys and girls who try to keep their hearts pure, clearly feel that God is near to them.

They don't see him with their own eyes, because He is a pure spirit, but they recognize his voice guiding them and his love in everything that happens, even in difficult times, and they experience the joy of his presence.

- I will pay attention in order to "see God" in others and to treat with respect the persons I shall meet.

At what point are we?



What helped me to feel God's presence?





Evaluation after the meeting

- Has a particular area emerged from the Gen 3 in which they feel it is difficult to practice purity in heart?
- What commitment have they taken to live it? Aim at accompanying and supporting them in their commitment until the next meeting.
- Do I consider the topic finished or is there still something to discuss in the next meeting?
- Did difficulties arise? What must we keep in mind to improve the next time?
