Survey Goa

To promote and spread the culture of peace in the environments where we are, to involve others in our commitment.



How did it go?

At the start, there is a moment of welcome, wherein it is important to allow space for dialogue and the sharing of what each one has lived, the experiences made, and the difficulties encountered. To welcome means to make each one feel accepted and be at ease: creativity will help us find the best ways. We may recall the aims set at the last meeting: "How did it go?"



TIME: about 30 minutes.

MATERIALS: folders with the two situations to act out, to give to the two groups (actors and audience)

PROCEDURE: In school and in other environments, sometimes we want to explain in a clear and simple way, something of our commitment for peace to persons and youth who know nothing of the Movement. This exercise can help us to find the right words and reasons when we are in similar situations.

We divide up into two groups and do role play. A group acts out a situation; the other group will be the audience. Then switch roles: the group that was the audience becomes the actors and vice versa. We have 5 minutes to organize and 10 minutes to present the play. We propose the following situations...

Situation 1: Run4unity

A district committee in your city wants to start a project to gather minors who live in the area. Call for a citizens' assembly where the youth can also present their ideas. You decide to present the Run4Unity as a chance for peace education, and as a project to attract young citizens.

AUDIENCE: Prepare some interesting and difficult questions that some present at the assembly would make.

Situation 2: TEENS Magazine

In your school library, there are some news journals and magazines for research. Most of the articles report negative facts that highlight a culture of "non peace". You desire to present – later to ask for subscription – the Teens magazine or New City that spreads positive values and highlights the contribution of many persons in peace building. You want to do it at the next school assembly.

How will you do it?

AUDIENCE: Participate actively by raising questions that your schoolmates may eventually ask.

CONCLUSION: Yu may give a feed back to the group that made the presentation. What did it achieve and what was most convincing? What was instead not clear or ineffective?

Then allow space for dialogue among all:

- What were your frustrations and/or successes? What was the main challenge? Did you overcome it?
- Is there something important you have learned from the activity that you would like to share to the group?
- What was lacking in the presentation? In actual life, is there something you are engaged in to spread your commitment for peace that was not shown here?



am an Arab Christian living in the Holy Land. Oftentimes, I encounter Israeli checkpoints, with meticulous checks on people and documents. There is a tense relationship between the people and the army; sometimes the hatred breaks out into arguments and violence. But the certainty that God loves us immensely, and calls the peace builders "happy", has changed my way of looking at these checkpoints. One day, when my turn arrived, the soldiers sent me back to the end of the line, without any reason, forcing me to wait again. When my turn came, I gave my document to the soldier with a smile. Surprised at my expression, so unusual in such environment, he asked me why I did it. I told him that I believed in God and that He is the one who gives me joy. Thinking of the many

terrorist acts caused in the world by violence and hate, he asked me why my God allows such happenings. I explained to him that God is not the one who does evil deeds, but it is people. Surprised, he said: «I'vɛ never met someone so happy!». !" But the real challenge was to know that, like us, there are also some Jewish youth who want to live for a united world. If it is true that there is no difference between Christians, Muslims and Jews, I must love all, without distinction. When I met one of them, I understood that for the first time in my life, I had talked with a Jew who was not a soldier.

At the start, we were a bit afraid, and then each one said what he thought of the situation: both of us wanted peace.

> Which pathway can we Gen 3 follow in order to build peace in the world?

First of all you should always have peace in your heart. Many times, there is no peace because there is a suffering, a doubt, an anxiety, something that torments us. In order to have peace we must embrace Jesus Forsaken; embrace Him and go out of ourselves immediately to live the present moment that comes right after. In this way, peace will return.

Then we must do all that we can in order to have peace among us Gen 3, to have peace among all the Gen 3

in the world. And we must cast away whatever obstacle there is in order to always have peace, that is, unity, Jesus in our midst.

We must also tend towards peace with the other branches of the Movement. We must strive always to have Jesus in the midst with everyone.

Lastly, in order to bring peace, you must give life everywhere to the "Teens for Unity Movement" because they too must be given the chance of having peace among all of you. This is your task.

Treat others with respect: each one is important. CELEBRATE! Rejoice with the success of the other as if it were your own. MAKE A DIFFERENCE! Great goals can be achieved only together.
